		30 Bring a shirt to school with a pattern: Stripes, squares.	1 Count all the rectangles you can find today	2 Play a card game
5 No School Are you traveling by car? Look at all the road signs. Identify their shapes. Are there any numbers?	6 No School Look at numbers inside your car: the speed. Notice how speed changes.	7 No School In the car: What shows how much gas we have? Can you tell how much gas is left? Do we need to fill up?	8 No School At the gas station: Notice numbers around the gas station. What happens as you fill up with gas? Notice gas gauge before and after filling up.	9 No School Play I spy game on the road. You can play I spy with shapes. Also play it with letters and sounds. Look for numbers on signs, addresses, and license plates. Look for numbers in order from 1-20? BINGO when you reach 20.
12 How long does it take to get to school? Is it closer than the supermarket? Let us time it. How many Km. or Miles is it? Let us measure.	13 Use direction words as you drive or walk around: I am turning left. I am driving over the highway. Describe the route (under a bridge, next to a park, next to the church, around the roundabout/oval)	14 Bake with your child today. Follow a recipe. Measure using measuring cups and measuring spoons.	15 Use ordinal numbers: first, second, third, fourth, fifth - whenever you can. Line up favorite toys and talk about the first one, second one, third one. Make up a story about 6 toys on a shelf in your room. The first one said...the second said... the third one said...	16 Play a board game with your child: Sorry, chutes and ladders.
19 Do you still have your coin collection jar? How much money is in it now? How many coins? Sort the coins.	20 Go to the grocery store with 5 soles today. What can you buy? How much change will have left?	21 Count count count. Count your steps. Count your heartbeats. Count sheep before you sleep. Does it help?	22 Read a number book at home. Count the pages. Look at page numbers in books. Find the book you have at home with the most pages.	23 Play a board game Play a card game with your child. See that they know the numerals 1-9. Good card games are: war, Go fish, UNO.
26 Play musical patterns: Listen to music and clap to the beat.	27 Compare quantities: Compare juice in 2 cups. Compare books on shelves. Which one has more? Which one has less?	28 Estimate: How many books do you think there are on this shelf? How many spoons do you see? How many forks do you think there are?	29 Use simple number stories: If you have 3 lollipops and your brother has 2. How many lollipops? (add) We have 5 cookies, and I ate one, how many are left? (subtract)	30 How many Halloween candies did you get at school today. Count them. How long can you make them last? Look at a calendar and decide how many you will eat each day. How long will they last?
