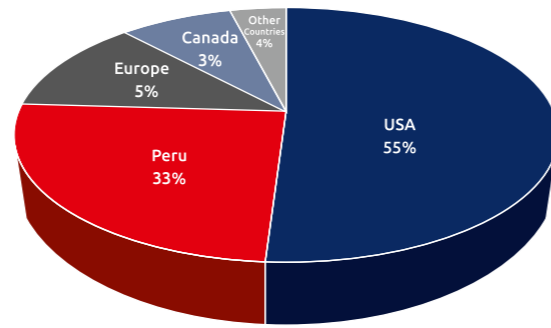

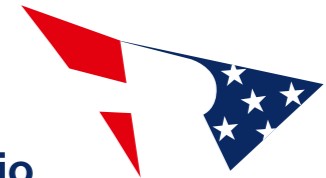

School and Community

Colegio Roosevelt is a K - 12 school in Lima, Peru founded by a group of American families in the mid 1940s with the intent of providing an American Education. Its students, faculty and staff are of various nationalities from every area of the world. Colegio Roosevelt is the official US State Department Office of Overseas Education School in Peru and serves the international business and diplomatic community, along with host country nationals. The school is divided into a Primary School that includes EC3 to grade 5, a Middle School that includes grades 6 to 8 and a High School that includes grades 9 to 12.

Academic Program

The program is co-educational, non-residential and extends from early childhood through twelfth grade. Colegio Roosevelt is an IB World School offering the Primary Years Program, The Middle Years Program and the Diploma Program between its three schools. Colegio Roosevelt, is accredited by AdvancEd and is authorized by The Peruvian Ministry of Education to deliver all 3 levels of EBR (Educación Básica Regular): Early Childhood, Primary and Secondary Education. The language of instruction is English. Students can earn the Colegio Roosevelt US Diploma, The Official Peruvian Certificate (OPP) and the International Baccalaureate Diploma (IBDP).

School Calendar

The school year consists of 180 teacher - student contact days from August through June and is divided into two semesters. As it is in the southern hemisphere, Colegio Roosevelt follows the Peruvian calendar and observes all Peruvian holidays and breaks. Along with this, the school follows the US academic calendar with students taking IB exams in May each year. This is a hybrid calendar designed to meet the needs of both the local and international communities. The weekly timetable is arranged to allow students to participate in activities of their choice or have extra study time.

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IB Diploma Program

The IB Diploma Program is a rigorous pre-university course of study designed for students in the 16 – 19 age range. It is a broad based two year course that aims to encourage students to be knowledgeable and inquiring, but also caring and compassionate. There is a strong emphasis on students developing intercultural understanding, open-mindedness, and the attitudes necessary for them to respect and evaluate a range of points of view.

The IB Diploma Program was introduced at Colegio Roosevelt in the 1992 - 1993 school year. The school will be completing the Program Evaluation for Reauthorization in the 2016 - 2017 academic year. Students take the full IB Diploma but also have the option to take individual subjects as well. The school has an open policy for students entering the Diploma Program and we actively support students who want to challenge themselves during the last two years of High School.

Innovation Academy

The Innovation Academy (IA) is a rigorous business and entrepreneurship program that empowers students with real-world projects that serve our community. At the heart of the academy is our interdisciplinary approach to learning. Students take four IA class with the same cohort in order to collaborate continuously, exchange ongoing feedback, and learn from adult experts in different fields. Students also enroll in three IB Diploma courses in Science, Mathematics and Spanish, balancing their exposure to theory and practice. This teaches students how to adapt to a variety of learning styles, which is essential when they do their internships and self-directed projects each year.

To enter the IA, students go through a thorough application process that concludes with an interview, and the final selections are made by a team of teachers. Now in the fourth year the IA Program continues to be a popular choice and includes more than 50 students in grades 10, 11 and 12. Official Peruvian Program

In addition to the Colegio Roosevelt Diploma (U.S. High School Equivalent Diploma) taught in English, and the option of obtaining the IB DP Diploma, Colegio Roosevelt also offers the Official Peruvian Program (OPP). This program is accredited by the Peruvian Ministry of Education and follows the general regulations of the Peruvian Educational System and leads to the awarding of an Official Peruvian Certificate of Studies.

The Official Peruvian Program's curriculum is aligned with the School's IB curriculum. All courses students take are transferred to the OPP system and are included in the corresponding certification. Courses pertaining to Peruvian Social Studies (9th and 12th grade) and Communications and Literature are taught in Spanish and follow the National Curriculum guidelines. Local Peruvian teachers are in charge of these subjects. Additional credits in English and P.E. are also required to complete the requisites for the Official Peruvian Certificate of Studies.

This program is offered to students who are native Spanish Speakers or are highly proficient in the language. An Official Peruvian Certificate of Studies is mandatory for Peruvian students and other Spanish speaking students transferring their studies or applying to Peruvian universities or universities in countries with which Peru has cultural, scientific and educational integration treaties.

High School Course of Studies

The MYP Program and the IB Diploma Program are the core of the FDR academic curriculum. All students will involve themselves in IB coursework regardless of the program they choose to follow for graduation. Additional non-IB courses are available to students in the Innovation Academy and the Official Peruvian Program that may be used towards graduation requirements.

High School Grading System

FDR does not rank its students and does not provide a Grade Point Average (GPA). Student progress and learning is assessed using the IB grading scale. Students are assessed both on their Approaches to Learning (ATL) and their Overall Level of Achievement (OLA). The OLA marks with their descriptors are listed below.

A note about grade equivalency: It is not possible to provide a standard comparison between IB grades and the letter grades commonly used in the US. For students moving from FDR to a US high school or university, we have estimated approximate equivalents between IB grades and US grades.

Graduation Requirements

One credit is awarded for each one-year course completed with a passing mark of 3 or above based on the IB grade scale of 1 - 7. One half-credit is awarded for each one-semester course completed. A minimum of 24 credits is required for graduation. Students transferring to FDR from another system may bring in a maximum of 8 credits per grade level. All students regardless of their program are expected to meet the requirements of the FDR Diploma.
